Ian has been ANGRMS secretary since 2008 when he took over from Di Ezzy. He was also active in a lot of other areas, helping out with various tasks such as rollingstock maintenance/restoration. Ian was a qualified sales officer, guard and station master as well as a trainer/assessor for these roles.

In later years Ian suffered badly from diabetes, spending a lot of time in hospital, etc. Despite this he always had a positive, bright and cheerful attitude.

lan was an only child but kept in close contact with his cousins and nieces. Our condolences and thought go out to his relatives as well as all of his friends.

He was a real gentleman and will be greatly missed – VALE IAN THOMPSON.

Every year as required by our SMS and to meet our obligations under the Rail Safety Act, we undertake various assurance activities. The first of these, a review of our risks, has been presented to the Board.

## **Volunteering and Training**

There are a lot of benefits in volunteering including learning new skills and enjoying the social benefits of our Railway. While previous railway, trade, or other experience is obviously of benefit, it is not compulsory or a prerequisite. There are a huge number and variety of jobs which don't require it. Where required such as being part of our operations team, training is provided.

Some examples of the various tasks we need more volunteers for are:

## Operations – (running days)

- Sales Ticket Office.
- Station Master.
- Guard.
- Fireman (this term is generic and not gender specific it applies to both diesel and steam).
- · Driver.

## Engineering:

- Maintenance and restoration of Locomotives and other rollingstock. Includes metal work as well as woodwork,
- Maintenance of railway infrastructure. Includes things like light track maintenance, maintain drainage, vegetation management, lineside fencing, etc.

## **Building and Grounds**

- Cutting grass, maintaining our gardens, etc.,
- Maintaining our buildings (some of which are over 100 years old!!), fences, picnic area, etc.

Other tasks which do not necessarily require you to be on site, can often be done at times that suit you, etc.:

- Writing of grant applications a very important part of our railway,
- Promote our railway help at shows and other ways of marketing, etc.

If you are reading this and not already involved, please consider helping out. Every bit helps. As they say, many hands make light work.

## **Track Matters**

#### **Peterson Road Station**

After the excitement of the delivery and installation of the Brisbane Metro Bus Shelters, work has been undertaken to complete the area with painting the station sign and safety lines and defining public access areas. Some areas of paintwork will require "touch-up" painting. With the help our contacts in Brisbane Metro, we located the supplier of the paint who identified the colour as "Translink Grey" and the paint obtained.

The story of the relocation of the Bus Shelters was shared within the Brisbane Metro project team, using the heading "Upcycling Metro Infrastructure". As well as images of the shelters being placed, it also included our brochure promoting train rides.

### Picnic Shelters - Woodford Station

The three shelters in the picnic area at Woodford Station were built in 1995 and one was subsequently relocated in conjunction with the erection of the locomotive storage shed. Minor repairs and repainting of two of these shelters is nearing completion. When finished work will then commence on repainting the remaining shelter.

#### **Trackwork**

Routine inspections are undertaken on a regular basis. Poisoning for vegetation control is undertaken when required commensurate with weather conditions.
